CONDITIONS

GENERAL REGULATIONS

The General Show Regulations apply to all competitions of the Show. These Conditions apply to the Alpaca Competition only. If there is inconsistency between the General Show Regulations and these Conditions for the Alpaca Competition, these Conditions prevail.

Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Alpaca Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

The Society may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability and Indemnity.

ALPACA CONDITIONS

1. REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

1.1 No refunds will be given for Livestock exhibits except where RASWA has excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

1.2 If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified by RASWA for any reason, other than RASWA's General Show Regulation 3.18, the entry fee will NOT be refundable.

2. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

2.1 Any Exhibitor giving an incorrect description of their exhibit with the intention of deceiving or defrauding RASWA, shall be disqualified from exhibiting at any future Perth Royal Shows.

2.2 RASWA may, at its sole discretion, require an Exhibitor to make a Statutory Declaration regarding their own exhibits.

2.3 RASWA reserves the right to combine colour classes if there are insufficient entries in any one (1) class.

3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1 Open to all registered Alpaca Breeders.

3.2 No companion animals are permitted other than Crias. The registered Owner of an exhibit (including wethers) must be a financial member of the AAA Ltd. A person or stud who, at the time of the Show, is not the person or stud in whose name the animal is registered on the IAR, is ineligible to exhibit that animal (with the exception of wethers).

4. REGISTRATION

4.1 Alpacas must be registered in a recognised Herd Book. The registered number of the animal together with full breeding details of sire and dam must be provided with each entry.

4.2 Even though Wethers do not have to be registered, they must have an NLIS approved tag.

4.3 For 2025, due to pavilion space restrictions, there are no current opportunities in the Jim Horwood Pavilion for animals to stay longer than the allocated three (3) days of competition.

5. AGE OF EXHIBITS

5.1 The age of an animal is taken on the first day of the Show; Saturday 27 September 2025.

6. WITHDRAWAL OF EXHIBIT

6.1 A Veterinary certificate must be provided to RASWA if an exhibit is withdrawn due to illness or injury.

6.2 To assist with penning planning, Exhibitors must notify the Competition and Event Coordinator of any withdrawals by emailing alpacas@raswa.org.au before Friday 12 September 2025.

7. FLEECE DELIVERIES

7.1 **ALL** fleeces must be delivered to one of the three (3) locations by COB Saturday 23 August 2025.

Only one (1) fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months prior to the Show may be shown from any one (1) animal.

7.2 Fleeces are to be clearly labelled in a clear plastic bag with identification cards including animal name, IAR/NLIS id and exhibitor name. No string, no ribbons, writing, or other items attached to bags.

7.3 All fleeces will be micron tested by RASWA

7.4 Fleece exhibitors have the option to submit noodled fleeces. In line with AAA rules, to reduce the potential to damage or contaminate fleeces, use only 1200mm wide x 1500mm long 80gsm kraft paper as the noodling material.

The paper must be clean and have no identifying marks on it - you must NOT write on the paper. Your noodled fleece will be weighed in the noodle and 140g will be deducted from your fleece weight.

8. FLEECE LENGTHS FOR SHOWING

8.1 Halter class entries must have a minimum fleece length of 50mm for Huacaya and Suri with a maximum fleece age of:

- Huacaya of under 14 months
- Suri in a first fleece of under 18 months; and
- Suri in a second or subsequent fleece of under 14 months

9. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

9.1 Exhibitors are to arrive and depart at the following times:

Arrive:

- Friday 26 September 2025 between 12 noon and 6pm - Enter through Gate 6 and exit through Gate 8. Drop off at the front roller door of the Jim Horwood Pavilion.

- Saturday 27 September 2025 between 6.00am and 8.00am - Enter through Gate 6 and exit through Gate 8. Drop off will be at the back of the Jim Horwood Pavilion.

Vehicles and trailers must be removed from the showground after delivery.

Departure:

9.3 A Livestock Release Authority Form is required to gain permission to leave the Showground once entered.

- Monday 29 September 2025 between 3.00pm and 7.00pm

A departure timetable will be constructed at the close of entries. Times will be allocated between 3.00pm and 7.00pm with exhibitors whom have to travel the furthest leaving first. No exhibitor is to leave later or earlier than these times.

All alpaca Exhibitors must follow these strict timelines to assist with the smooth running of arrivals and departures.

Early Departure:

9.4 In writing before show commencement, pregnant females may depart the showground early if either of the following conditions are met and records are produced to the Council Lead, Chief Steward or RASWA;

- An ultrasound certificate confirming pregnancy is produced.
- An active mating record in eAlpaca is produced for a female 18 months or older. The pregnancy must be at least 3 months old.

9.5 RASWA Veterinarian authorisation is required for sick or stressed animals to depart the Showground earlier than the stated time.

10. ENTRY AND EXIT OF ALPACA EXHIBITS - ACCESS TO THE SHOWGROUND

10.1 ENTRY: Exhibitors will be issued with a vehicle pass to deliver exhibits during Show hours. All passengers in the vehicle must present a single-entry or multi-entry pass (no exclusions). Drivers are required to enter through Gate 6 (off Graylands Road) and proceed to the unloading area at the east end of the Jim Horwood Pavilion (side closest to gate 8).

No delays are permitted in the unloading area, and vehicles must be moved immediately after unloading.

10.2 EXIT: Drivers must exit the Showground through Gate 8.

11. TICKETS

11.1 Exhibitors will be issued the following number of multi-entry passes depending on the number of exhibits entered:

- 1 - 4 Exhibits: 2 multi-entry passes
- 5 - 8 Exhibits: 3 multi-entry passes
- 8+ Exhibits: 4 multi-entry passes

Passes will be emailed after close of entries.

12. PAVILION OPENING TIMES

12.1 The Jim Horwood Pavilion will be open to the public from 10.00am to 6.00pm daily.

13. FEED

13.1 Will be the Exhibitor's responsibility.

14. FEED LOCKERS

14.1 A limited number of lockers will be available and will be allocated by the Chief Steward on arrival at the Showground. Sharing may be necessary.

15. ADVERTISING AND SIGNAGE

15.1 Stud promotional signage may be displayed on pens from the first day of the Show. Advertising material must not exceed the height of the pen.

15.2 No signage identifying individual animals is to be displayed on pens.

15.3 No animal 'For Sale' signage is to be displayed on pens.

16. TROPHIES

16.1 Perpetual trophies are to be returned to RASWA at the conclusion of the Show. The exception on this rule is the Carmen Graham Memorial Trophy which may be held by the Perth Royal Shows' most successful exhibitor until the following year. Replica trophies are the property of the Exhibitor.

17. YOUTH HANDLERS AND YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITION

17.1 Entries must be lodged on the eAlpaca application for entry. Entries will not be accepted on the day of Judging.

17.2 Exhibitor passes will be forwarded to the contact person on the application for entry.

17.3 The age of the handler is taken on the first day of the Show; Saturday 27 September 2025

17.4 Animals used for the Youth Handlers this year will be sourced from the animals that are already on the ground for competition, if you do NOT have an animal to show it is the exhibitors' responsibility to organise their own animal and reach out to another exhibitor on site.

17.5 Dress code for the Youth Handlers is safe and inspired by the Australian Stockman. This includes closed shoes (black or brown boots preferable), long trousers (not leggings), collared long sleeved shirt minimal/no loose jewellery and hair tied up. Hats are optional as the event is inside.

17.6 Dress code for the Young Judges is more formal than Youth Handlers, requiring a jacket plus the Youth Handlers uniform.

18. MOVEMENT OF STOCK TO WA / JOHNE'S DISEASE (JD)

18.1 There are strict requirements for bringing livestock into WA. A completed Health Certificate for Movement of Stock to Western Australia (Form LB1), available from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, must accompany each consignment of livestock en route into WA. It contains all entry requirements for livestock and is used to certify that livestock meet these requirements.

19. NATIONAL VENDOR DECLARATION (NVD/WAYBILL)

19.1 Whenever livestock leave a property, movement documentation must be provided. A Waybill, a combined National Vendor Declaration (NVD/Waybill) or permit must show where the movement commenced and finished, including the property identification code (PIC) of both properties.

19.2 The Exhibitor is responsible for ensuring that the original copy of the NVD/Waybill or permit is delivered to the Chief Steward upon arrival.

20. VERIFICATION / INSPECTION OF TYPE, DESCRIPTION AND ELIGIBILITY

20.1 Each exhibit may be subject to inspection and/or examination by an Inspector or Inspectors appointed by RASWA.

20.2 RASWA will nominate two (2) names of persons qualified to act as Inspectors in order to facilitate the appointment of an Inspector or Inspectors by RASWA for the purpose of RASWA's General Show Regulation 3.18.

20.3 The Inspector(s) appointed must submit to RASWA, in writing, a complete report of their findings immediately after the completion of the inspection.

21. VETERINARY SERVICES

21.1 A Veterinary Officer will be on call throughout the Show to provide services to injured or sick livestock. Exhibitors requiring services will be responsible for payment for all services rendered.

21.2 The Veterinary Office and Medication Control Centre is located at the corner of Edgar Avenue and the Cattle Lanes.

21.3 The duty Veterinary Officer can be contacted from 6.00am to 9.00pm through Asset Services on (08) 6263 3161 or (08) 6263 3146. After 9.00pm on any day please call Asset Services on (08) 6263 3127.

22. RIBBONS

22.1 Ribbons will be awarded at the discretion of the Judge(s).

23. GRAND PARADES

23.1 Grand Parades will be held at the following times:

- 1pm on Saturday 27 September

24. SUBSTITUTION

24.1 Substitution of an animal will be permitted as a direct substitute for any single-entry alpaca exhibit. Only like for like substitution is available in 2025. Late exhibit changes may not necessarily be included in the catalogue. Substitution must be made by **Friday 12 September 2025**.

25. RASWA PIC NUMBER

26. PROTESTS

26.1 An Exhibitor may protest against an award won by an exhibit or Competitor, alleging breach of RASWA's General Show Regulations or Section Conditions or ineligibility.

26.2 A protest must be made in writing, giving reasons for the protest and signed and submitted to the Councillor in Charge, not more than one (1) hour after the completion of the judging of the class.

26.3 Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to RASWA if in the opinion of the Councillor in Charge the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.

26.4 If an exhibit is awarded a prize and is subsequently disqualified the prize will not automatically be awarded to the next placegetter. The final decision will be at the discretion of the Judge(s).

26.5 Any prize money awarded for an event, which is the subject of protest, shall be retained by RASWA until the protest has been resolved.

GOVERNOR'S CUP

Governor's Cup Award

A Trophy known as the Governor's Cup has been competed for at every Perth Royal Show since 1896. (No Perth Royal Shows were held for the years 1940-45, and 2020). The winners since 2009 have been:

1. The object of the Governor's Cup award is to encourage Exhibitors to compete with the highest quality pedigree breeding exhibits and reward both excellence and consistency throughout the whole range of their exhibits.
2. The Governor's Cup is only open to bonafide Western Australian Exhibitors. Government Institutions including Agricultural Schools and Colleges are eligible to compete.
3. ALL ANIMALS ARE TO BE ENTIRE e.g. Geldings and spayed mares are not allowed.
4. Sections and Breed classes in which points can be gained are as follows with exclusions as stated:

ALPACA: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Group and Special classes.

CATTLE: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Progeny, Group and Special classes.

GOATS: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Progeny and Group classes.

HORSES: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Ridden, Group and Special classes.

SHEEP: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes and Pairs, but excluding Novice, Group and Special classes.
5. All livestock exhibits must be either:
 - (a) Bred by the Exhibitor, or owned, leased or syndicated by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) months as at the date of judging and provide proof of the transaction by way of receipts or registration papers.
 - (b) Exhibited by the original owner under arrangement with the purchaser.
6. (a) The Exhibitor can enter all classes in their breed section, but the maximum number of classes for which an Exhibitor will gain Governor's Cup points are from the highest scoring ten (10) Single Pen classes.
 - (b) In the event of a tie for first place, the Governor's Cup will be jointly awarded.
7. An EXHIBIT is DEFINED, for the purposes of this award, as follows:
 - (a) As per Single Pen classes.
AN EXHIBIT MAY ONLY RECEIVE POINTS ONCE.
8. Points will be allotted as follows:

First 4 points
Second 2 points
Third 1 point

If an Exhibitor has multiple placing's within a class then all placing points will be included in the total for that class. Championships will NOT be included unless the circumstances below apply:
9. Points will not be allocated unless at least TWO (2) EXHIBITORS participate in each class except in the event of the animal going on to win a Championship or Reserve Championship with competition, in which case points scored on the Governor's up scale will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed. If an animal has not been awarded any Governor's Cup points because it faced no competition in its breed or section, but that animal goes on to win an award with competition, points scored on the Governor's Cup scale will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed.
10. Livestock sections should address a means of promoting excellence within their respective areas. It will lead to competition across the sections.
11. Declaration on Entry Form: To be eligible for participation in the Governor's Cup Competition you must have signed the Declaration on the entry form to acknowledge that you have read all the Rules and Regulations governing the Governor's Cup Competition and you agree to abide by them.

SURI CLASSES

CORRECT ANIMAL COLOUR

An Alpaca is to be shown in the appropriate colour class, when it is predominantly that colour. Any colour variations will be assessed at the Judge's discretion.

A Fancy Alpaca is to be shown in the Fancy class if it has an unusual or striking distribution of colour e.g. different colour saddle markings.

CLASSES

Classes may be split or joined to the most suitable age/colour if numbers warrant. No Suri is eligible to compete for Championships in the Huacaya classes.
